- **Mandatory Second Language:** All students must study Afrikaans up to the IGCSE level at Village International Academy. This requirement stems from the USAF regulations, which mandate attainment of the Afrikaans IGCSE level for exemptions into South African universities.
- **Third Language Option:** In the foundation stage, all students must learn French in their language curriculum. This initiative aims to give students a multilingual foundation and enhance their linguistic skills.

To support language development, we offer specialised programmes and resources:

- Language Enrichment Programmes: Additional language classes and workshops are offered to strengthen language skills beyond the regular curriculum.
- **Individualised Support:** Personalised support through tutoring and targeted interventions for students needing extra help in language acquisition.
- **Special Assessment Considerations:** Students requiring examination concessions, such as extra time, scribes, or other forms of support, may be referred to an educational psychologist or speech therapist for assessment. This assessment will determine the accommodations that best support these students during examinations and academic assessments.
